



Study Plan LL.M. Educational Program with University of Warwick

Important Rules

- This study plan is designed for students taking part in the mentioned LL.M. Educational Program and spending the academic year 2025-2026 at the University of Warwick. The list of courses to be taken abroad may be subject to changes should the academic offer at Warwick be amended.
- Interested students are required to read and understand this study plan and its rules. These are to be considered binding to the successful completion of the LL.M. Educational Program. Changes to the study plan are usually not possible and any request in this sense must be conveyed to the International Development Office and the academic coordinator.
- During the mobility, students will be subject to the rules of the partner university.
- At the end of the program, if compliant with both Luiss and University of Warwick academic requirements, students will obtain both the LL.M. Degree (issued by the University of Warwick) and the Single Cycle Master's Degree in Law (issued by Luiss).

Study Plan

LL.M. at Warwick is 180 CATS¹ equal to 90 ECTS (60 ECTS taught courses² and 30 ECTS for the dissertation).

During the V year, students will study at the University of Warwick in one of the following LL.M.:

- **LL.M. in Advanced Legal Studies** open to students majoring in Diritto Internazionale, European Law, Law and Innovation, Diritto Penale, Diritto Societario e Tributario, Diritto ed Economia delle Imprese, Diritto del Lavoro e della Previdenza Sociale, Diritto Civile, Diritto Amministrativo
- **LL.M. in International Economic Law** open to students majoring in Diritto Internazionale
- **LL.M. in International Commercial Law** open to students majoring in Diritto Internazionale, Diritto Societario e Tributario, Diritto ed Economia delle Imprese, Diritto Civile
- **LL.M. in International Development Law & Human Rights** open to students majoring in Diritto Internazionale
- **LL.M. in International Corporate Governance & Financial Regulation** open to students majoring in Diritto Societario e Tributario, Diritto ed Economia delle Imprese, Diritto Civile

Thesis and Graduation

- Students will complete the thesis for Warwick following the Partner University deadlines, during the mobility period. Students will submit a provisional topic in late January, will develop their full proposal by the middle of March, and will start working on their thesis from late April onwards (once they have submitted their assessments). Formal supervision is provided until the end of June, and the final dissertation has to be submitted in early September.
- Students will identify a Luiss supervisor and will need to follow the regular [Luiss procedure and deadlines](#) for the graduation at Luiss.
- Once returned to Luiss, they will defend the Master thesis at Luiss in July, in October / November (depending on the availability of transcript of records), or March/April.

Grade Conversion and Conversion Table

The academic activities recognized by the partner university will be transferred according to a Block Transfer Recognition.

During the V year the student will follow courses and take exams at the Partner University, in order to receive the LL.M. Degree. Upon his/her return, all the courses reported on the "Transcript of Records" issued by the foreign university will be recognized on the Luiss student's career through a Block Transfer Recognition, which will automatically recognize all the courses of the Luiss profile chosen (IV year II semester and V year I and II semester).

Grades will be transferred based on the calculation of the weighted average of the LL.M. grades. The weighted average grade of the courses taken abroad is converted following the grade conversion table (see below). Please note that the LL.M. thesis grade is excluded from the calculation. Grades will not be rounded up under any circumstance.
